Our annual National Tasting Project (NTP) brought the return of those brown paper bags. Different from past years tasting projects, the National Chapter introduced to a two tier tasting that would span two meetings this year. Unfortunately, due to logistics, weather, and cost trying to pull this off became too tough of a grape to crush. (Ok a bad Nut to Crack analogy). Our president Terri Newman-Hyde presented our chapter a modified format choosing wines from the first tier and the more costly second tier offerings. The topic for the tasting was the ever growing in popularity Rhone Ranger wines. With juice from the grapes of Syrah, Grenache, Marsanne, Viognier, plus so many others, a smorgasbord of wonderful wines and blends are available from the Rhone varietals. West Coast producers in the 1980s formed a group with a catchy name, Rhone Rangers, which has spread across our nation. They have promoted and elevated the Rhone varietals grown in the US to

national recognition. The actual NTP tasting was abnormally quiet for our group as each wine was tasted and scored. A short overview of the goals of the tasting and expectations was given by Terri before the white and red groupings.
